## DISTRICT CONSULTANT

In order to become one the foundation would have its own board of directors, articles of incorporation, and work to get tax exempt status. ## PROGRESS AND SERVICE REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

#### Library Display

- This month we are featuring gardening books and mysteries
- The sandwich board in the lobby lists museum passes that patrons may check out or are in the works
- A spring background has been added to the lobby "photo booth"

# **Museum Passes**

- The library is currently working on obtaining and/or renewing library organizational passes for museums, historic sites, and gardens
- The goal is to have the passes in place before summer vacations begin
- The passes are fantastic advertisement for the library

- Patrons must visit the library to check out the pass and they must also visit again to return it
- Passes are not shipped in the bins
- We have been asking local business and donors to sponsor a pass.
- Fabric Mart sponsored the Hands on House pass (\$175 for 2 passes)
- Elaine and Paul Halchak sponsored the Lancaster Science Factory Pass (\$375)
- The Friends of the Sinking Spring Library gave us a check for three passes (\$1320)

## **Programing**

- Currently scheduling programs for the entire year.
- The goal is to have the entire schedule in place before school ends
- The flexibility exists to add other programs if something interesting arises
- This year we will have a garden series, a history series, a craft series, and some programs on animals.
- Charles Adams will return for a ghost story program in October

#### Staff

- Interviewed applicants
- In the process of checking references and getting clearance for a bilingual candidate
- Held a brainstorming meeting with staff March 31st
- Planned a passport meeting and general staff meeting for May
- Planning a pot luck dinner for staff to build morale

## Reading Public Library (Main Library)

- Visited the Reading Public Library
- Examined Reading's "bug zapper" system
- System can be folded and stored
- Kills bed bugs and eggs
- Cost is approximately \$229

#### **Rotary Club**

- Attended the Spring Township Rotary Club meeting
- Talked about some of the programs and activities at the library
- Discussed fundraising efforts and the mission of the library

# **Computers**

- Roy from BCPL put two of the desk top computers on WIFI in order to allow more flexibility in their placement in the library
- Need to look into purchasing a lap top for library program power point presentations.
- Some presenters do not have a laptop and just bring a flash drive for their presentation

## **Air Conditioning Units**

- There were a couple of days that the library was really warm/hot
- The air-conditioning units do not seem to be cooling properly
- One day this week the air was on the lowest setting and it was very hot in the library
- The temperature was registered as 78 degrees
- The units may need to be serviced and the coolant levels checked
- Discussed this with the borough manager- Mike said he would call for service

- Priced club chairs
- Received 2 quotes on the same style chair
- The Next Generation Furniture quote is \$560.68 cheaper than K-LOG
- The library will ask the Friends group about paying for the chairs

# **Fundraising-Spring Garden Nursery**

- Contacted Spring Garden Nursery regarding a Plant Sale
- Due to time limitations a fall Chrysanthemum sale was discussed instead
- Owner is willing to work with the library
- We should contact him end of July/early August
- Will price another greenhouse to compare
- Another potential fundraiser is holding a poinsettia sale before Christmas

## **Fundraiser- Potential Event location**

- Possible fundraiser event at Eight 20 Events (old Vanity Fair Complex in West Reading)
- Amanda said that she would be willing to comp the room rental for the library
- The venue appears to have a liquor license, but more research needs to be done on this
- There is plenty of parking
- It is recommended that committee should be formed to explore this idea further

## Fundraiser- Longwood Garden Bus Trip

- Klein's Bus runs trips
- There is a choice of 2 bus sizes
- The buses can play a Christmas movie
- There is storage for a cooler to provide water bottles for the participants

- Not sure if we will have enough time to plan this before December
- Mike Hart mentioned parking as a concern

#### **Fundraiser- Felted Wool Flower Brooches**
